By being good global citizens and Concern Ambassadors for our school, we can support Concern's Vision



Some of you maybe familiar with this slide?

The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals are a blueprint (plan) to achieve a better (more sustainable) future for all.

They address the global challenges we face, including poverty, inequality, climate change, and the barriers to peace and justice. As a member country of the UN, the UK government have signed up to help achieve these goals.



SDG1 aims to eradicate extreme poverty for all people everywhere, which closely aligns with Concerns mission

Teacher Tip – point out – at first glance, it may look like a family living in poverty but they are also happy, smiling family, well dressed – maybe we shouldn't jump to conclusions about other communities



SDG 16 focuses on several key areas, 2 of which are...

Access to Justice: Ensuring equal access to justice for all individuals – again aligning with Concern's mission and vision

and

Promoting Peaceful Societies: Encouraging the reduction of violence and related deaths. As reported by the UN, 1 person died every 12 minutes because of global conflict events. Concern or their partners were involved in offering emergency and life-saving support to those affected by conflict

Emergencies

In 2024, we responded to 50 emergencies in 22 countries, reaching more than 6.8 million people directly and almost 10 million people indirectly.

Concern responded to emergencies in the Middle East, in countries like, Gaza, and Afghanistan, Sudan and continues to work in places like Ukraine and Syria – shown here on (click to map)

MAIN OBJECTIVES ARE TO:

- Respond rapidly to save lives and reduce suffering
- Improve access to food, shelter, healthcare and water
- Prevent and reduce the impact of emergencies



Would you know the names of some of these countries if they weren't labelled? Concern worked in 27 countries last year, and provided aid to over 27 million people (point to Somalia on map)

Somalia has faced many hardships and crisis, created by political instability, conflict, hunger, and climate change. Concern has worked here for 40 years with both emergency interventions and longer-term projects, such as educational programmes Concern helped 30,000 vulnerable children by providing them with free education

Education

30,000 vulnerable children provided with free education in displacementaffected communities in Somalia.




Ending extreme poverty, whatever it takes

Omar and others like him continue to need your support, so that's were we come in, we need to raise funds to help other students like Omar receive the education they deserve, but also help displaced people of Gaza, help mothers feed their children in Yeman, or help people in Afghanistan affected by the recent earthquake
