that could support determined mothers like Ruksana to build a better future

Like many living in Del Para, a coastal community in Bangladesh, Ruksana's family depend on fishing.

Her husband is a fisherman but often returns home emptyhanded and, in an area prone to cyclones and storms, his livelihood is precarious.


Yet with support and training from Concern, Ruksana has cultivated a new source of food and income. Along with the provision of seeds and tools, Ruksana has learnt climateresistant gardening techniques like seedbed and sack bag planting and hanging vegetable

gardening, to protect crops during cyclones.

"As my youngest daughter Salma is malnourished, this vegetable garden will help her and my upcoming child with their nutritional needs. I will be able to eat these vegetables in the future. I will also sell these vegetables", says Ruksana.

She is determined to give her children a better future. The two eldest go to school and Ruksana plans for Salma to as well saying, "I want them to be educated." One person can make a difference. With hard work and determination, Ruksana has built a sustainable livelihood.

Today, Beatha is the president of her community Farming Association in rural Rwanda.

She is someone who people look up to and seek advice from. "They said I was a good leader," explains Beatha, "even though I wasn't able to continue school... they saw something in me." This is even more inspiring when you consider that Beatha went from having no regular work or income, to building a growing farm with her husband and supporting their three children.

Change began when Beatha decided to take part in Concern's 'Graduation Programme', which offers support to the most vulnerable families. Initially, Beatha and her husband received help to build a home, with training on how to handmake bricks. With a small plot of land,

they began to cultivate a kitchen garden and invest in seeds and livestock.

Beatha was elected leader of her local Farming Association, and her success in cultivating her land has created a ripple effect through her community. Now, many more villagers have better harvests and store surplus beans and millet at the Farming Association. There is food people can rely on in the rainy seasons, and more jobs on expanding farms.

"Life is better now. Now, things are going well. We no longer face a lot of challenges. We are able to pay for health insurance. The members of the Farming Association say they want to learn from me. They say that I help them and strengthen them with my ideas," Beatha says.

How to put the Power of ONE into your Will

Follow these four simple steps to one day help end extreme poverty.

Step 1: Decide on your gift

There are three types of gift you can leave:

- A residuary gift a share of what is left after your loved ones have been provided for.
- A pecuniary gift a specified amount of money.
- A specific gift such as a piece of jewellery, property or an heirloom.

Step 2: Speak to your solicitor

When making your Will or adding a codicil to amend your existing Will, we recommend you use a solicitor, to make sure your wishes are carried out. You will need Concern's registered charity details, which you can find on the back cover of this brochure.

We offer a Free Will Writing service – details can be found in the back of your pack.

Step 3: Talk to your family and executors

Once you've looked after your loved ones, even 1% of your estate can help end poverty. Letting your family and Executors know your wishes ensures they can carry them out with confidence and peace of mind.

Step 4: Let us know

If you're planning to leave a gift in your Will, we'd love to hear from you.
